RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE FISCAL YEARS 2019 AND 2020 UNIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP) TO ADD THREE STUDIES UNDER TASK 5.2 “SMART MOVES PROGRAM”

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Agreement creating and establishing the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Miami Urbanized Area requires that the Miami-Dade Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), in its role as the MPO, provide a structure to evaluate the adequacy of the transportation planning and programming process; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation Planning Council (TPC) has been established and charged with the responsibility and duty of fulfilling the aforementioned functions; and

WHEREAS, the TPC has reviewed the amendment to the Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), made a part hereof, and finds it consistent with the goals and objectives of the Transportation Plan for the Miami Urbanized Area,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION IN ITS ROLE AS THE MPO FOR THE MIAMI URBANIZED AREA, that the attached amendment to the Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) to add three studies under Task 5.2 “SMART Moves Program”, is hereby approved.

1	<p>City of Aventura/Ojus Mobility Access Study</p> <p>The objective is to conduct a multimodal transportation study to evaluate potential mobility improvements and provide for first mile/last-mile connections from the train station within the City of Aventura and the Ojus neighborhood bearing in mind important points of interest like the upcoming station and the existing Aventura Mall Transit Hub. The improvements include transit, bicycle, pedestrian and other mobility options. The recommendations of this study can also serve to support and enhance the connection once the bridge is in operation.</p>	\$85,000
2	<p>Florida City Mobility Study</p> <p>The objective is to conduct a multimodal transportation study to provide connectivity, mobility and safety for pedestrians, bicyclists, and transit users. The plan will identify the appropriate scale of transportation technology, infrastructure and amenities to facilitate the usage of the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) station as well as efficient multimodal connections within Florida City. The study area includes the limits of the City of Florida City.</p>	\$80,000
3	<p>SW 244 Street Mobility Hubs Study Unincorporated Miami-Dade County</p> <p>The objective is to conduct a multimodal transportation study to provide connectivity, mobility and safety for pedestrians, bicyclists, and transit users. The plan will identify, the appropriate scale of transportation technology, infrastructure and amenities to facilitate the usage of the BRT station as well as efficient multimodal connections within study area. The study area is within unincorporated Miami-Dade County and encompasses a 2-mile radius for motorized vehicle connections and a 1-mile radius for non-motorized vehicles connections surrounding the proposed BRT station at SW 244th Street.</p>	\$69,000
