WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Miami-Dade Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) MiamiDadeTPO.org

The Strategic Miami Area Rapid Transit (SMART) Program continues to revitalize Miami-Dade County's transportation system by advancing rapid transit corridors to accomplish objectives of delivering a safer, cleaner. more efficient, and connected system. TPO's SMART Demonstration projects continue to complement the SMART Program. The program includes a mixture of federal, state, and local funding and has successfully funded 46 new mobility projects, exceeding 9.1 million riders since the program's inception, TPO is also implementing the award-winning SMART Street Transportation Enhancements Program (STEP) to facilitate interagency coordination, innovation, and accelerated implementation of bicycle/pedestrian improvement projects that increase connectivity and enhance safety. TPO also continues to pursue the Urban Air Mobility (UAM) and Connected Autonomous Vehicle (CAV) spaces by releasing a UAM Study and actively participating in statewide and local UAM and CAV working and study advisory groups, respectively. Finally, "TPO on the Go" short video series continues with live on-camera interviews during public outreach events, highlighting comments and concerns from the traveling public, as well as responses from partner agencies.

Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) BrowardMPO.org

The past year, Broward MPO, in partnership with Broward County, was awarded a \$5 million Safe Streets and Roads for All (\$\$4A) grant from the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) to develop a comprehensive Safety Action Plan to establish a countywide Safe System Approach. The Plan will provide a clear path to reduce traffic fatalities and severe injuries by developing alternatives, recommendations, and strategies to address safety. Broward MPO continued with the implementation of \$400 million investment in Complete Streets. Thirteen projects (totaling \$50 million) were completed, adding 28 miles of multimodal facilities. Additionally, five projects (totaling \$21.4 million) funded through a TIGER federal grant were completed, adding another 9 miles to











the network. A further noteworthy effort, Broward MPO facilitated the creation of Metro Transportation Engineering & Construction Cooperative (MTECC) to assist partner municipalities with the planning, design, and construction of transportation related projects. Broward MPO is committed to continue creating a future where the transportation landscape is enhanced, improved, and sustainable, fostering a community that benefits everyone.

Palm Beach Transportation Planning Agency (TPA) PalmBeachTPA.org

The Palm Beach TPA continues to prioritize Complete Streets projects and initiatives towards its vision of a safe, efficient, and connected multimodal transportation system. In 2023, the Town of Lake Park and City of Westlake adopted Vision Zero Resolutions for a total of 13 municipalities committing to zero traffic-related deaths and serious injuries. The Cities of Westlake and Boca Raton also adopted Complete Streets Policies. Multiple roadway safety audits identified pedestrian and bicycle improvements including those on local streets, and at a recently constructed Diverging Diamond Interchange. Over the next five years, approximately \$90 million has been programmed for active transportation improvements, and nearly \$30 million for transit, including new shelters, transit signal priority, and electric buses. The first separated bicycle lanes on both state and county roads are under construction. Finally, the TPA has led multiple forums on Vision Zero, Complete Streets, Transportation and Land Use, and Transit Oriented Development to advance policy initiatives.

HONORABLE DANIELLA LEVINE CAVA MAYOR, MIAMI-DADE COUNTY

Daniella Levine Cava was elected Miami-Dade County's first-ever woman Mayor in November 2020. She enters the Mayor's office following a 40-year career as a relentless advocate for South Florida families in public service and elected leadership. Mayor Levine Cava's administration is focused on building a stronger, more inclusive, more resilient Miami-Dade: prioritizing reforms to make our county safer and prevent gun violence through the Peace and Prosperity Plan; restoring and reinvigorating a thriving economy that delivers economic security for Miami-

Dade businesses and families and attracts new industries; saving Biscayne Bay and building and protecting our environment; and directly engaging with residents to make local government more responsive, transparent, and accountable.



HONORABLE ESTEBAN BOVO, JR. CHAIRMAN, MIAMI-DADE TPO & MAYOR, CITY OF HIALEAH

In 2021, Esteban Bovo, Jr. was elected City of Hialeah Mayor, and in 2023 elected Miami-Dade TPO Governing Board Chairman. Prior to being Mayor, he served as Miami-Dade County Commissioner representing District 13, and BCC Chair for the 2017-2018 term. During his tenure, he established a Chairman's Policy Council to address several key issues including mass transit expansion funding, sea level rise, and housing affordability, etc. Chairman Bovo also served as State Representative for District 110 from

2008-2011 where he was elected Hispanic Legislative Caucus Chairman and Chair of the House Committee of Business Regulation. Chairman Bovo was born in Queens, New York and has been a proud resident of Miami-Dade County for over 47 years.

Miami-Dade TPO Board Member Raquel Regalado also serves Miami-Dade County's 7th District on the Board of County Commissioners. In 2010, she ran for and was elected to the Miami-Dade County Public School Board (M-DCPS). Ms. Regalado is admitted to practice law in Florida state courts and in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Florida. She has focused on corporate litigation, real estate,

asset valuation, and intellectual property. She earned a Juris Doctorate degree from St. Thomas University School of Law, a B.A. from Florida International University, and attended Miami-Dade Community College Honors and Coral Gables Senior High.



Prior to co-founding City Thread, she was Director of Local Innovation at PeopleforBikes, leading

local programs and managing the Final Mile: where Austin, Denver, New Orleans, Pittsburgh, and Providence constructed 335 miles of new, safe, and connected bikeways – moving projects from concept to completion in only 24 months. They are now on pace to fully build their planned networks 25 years earlier than expected. She is recognized as a national leader for her ability to launch campaigns, build programs, and raise funds that support resident-led mobility, urban planning, and public space activations.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER GIL (GUILLERMO) PENALOSA, MBA, PHDHC, CSP **FOUNDER & CHAIR, 8 80 CITIES; FOUNDER, CITIES FOR EVERYONE: PRESIDENT. GIL PENALOSA & ASSOCIATES**

Gil Penalosa is passionate about cities for all people. He advises ers and communities worldwide on how to decision mak create vibrant cities and healthy communities for all, regardless of age, gender, ability and social, economic, or ethnic background. His focus is on the design and use of parks and streets as great public places, as well as the promotion of sustainable mobility:

walking, riding bicycles, using public transit, and new use of cars. Because of Gil's unique blend of experience, pragmatism, and passion, many cities and organizations worldwide seek his leadership and valuable advice. He has worked in over 350 cities on all continents. In 2022 Gil ran for mayor of Toronto. In 100 days, he obtained 100,000 votes, and changed the conversation, which was his objective. He came in second of 31 candidates. His focus was on how to create an affordable, equitable, and sustainable city, a Toronto for Everyone. Gil is the Founder and Chair of the successful Canadian non-profit organization 8 80 Cities. In addition, Gil is founder of Cities for Everyone and leads a private consulting firm, Gil Penalosa & Associates, providing services as an inspirational keynote speaker, instructor of Master Classes, and advisor to decision makers and communities. Currently Gil is an academic chair at the Norman Foster Institute for Sustainable Cities, as well as Expert Advisor to the International Society for Urban Health. For years he was advisor to the Vision Zero Network, America Walks, Gehl Architects, and Project for Public Spaces, amongst many organizations. Throughout his career, Gil has been a strong advocate for improving city parks, making his first mark in Bogotá, Colombia, where he led the design and construction of over 200 parks - including Simon Bolivar, a 113-hectare park in the heart of the city. His team also radically transformed the Ciclovia / Open Streets – from a program of few kilometers to one that sees over a million people walk, run, and bike along 121km/ 75 mi of Bogotá's roads every Sunday of the year, and today is internationally recognized and emulated.

Gil was elected twice as chair of World Urban Parks and was its first ambassador. He holds an MBA from UCLA's Anderson School of Management, where he was selected as one of the "100 Most Inspirational Alumni" in the school's history. Gil received a Doctorate Honoris Causa from the Faculty of Urban Planning at the prominent Swedish university, SLU. He received in Australia the World Urban Parks Annual Distinguished Individual Award. In 2023 Gil was selected by Identity Review in the 15 Thought Leaders in Sustainable City Development and voted to Planetizen's Top 100 Most Influential Contemporary Urbanists, at #13.

PROJECT 4 DILLMAN TRAIL CITY OF GREENACRES

Greenacres' Dillman Trail, a 3/4 mile shared-use path, enhances connectivity for safe walking and biking. A collaborative effort with Palm Beach TPA and FDOT District Four, this project showcases the power of local partnerships, promoting a healthier, active lifestyle.



PROJECT 5 DOWNTOWN ENHANCEMENT TOWN OF LAUDERDALE-BY-THE-SEA

Lauderdale by the Sea's Downtown Enhancement project, funded by an ARPA grant, revitalizes the downtown area with expanded outdoor seating, sidewalks, and lighting. Incorporating resident feedback through public meetings and surveys, the enhanced downtown features promote economic development while preserving small-town charm.



PROIFCT 6 DOWNTOWN FLAGLER STREET BEAUTIFICATION, CITY OF MIAMI

Flagler Street Beautification transformed Miami's historic corridor into a vibrant boulevard, prioritizing the pedestrian experience and economic growth. Completed sections feature patterned pavers, sidewalks, and upgraded drainage systems, fostering community gatherings and a renewed sense of identity.



Our Mission

The Miami-Dade Department of Transportation and Public Works (DTPW) develops, coordinates, and operates the County's transportation networks with the goal of creating a safer, more resilient, connected, and sustainable community for our residents, businesses, and visitors.

Miami-Dade County's VISION ZERO Program is

the County's key safety initiative, representing a systematic approach to the planning and implementation of transportation safety countermeasures, supported by policies focused on reducing, and ultimately eliminating, traffic fatalities and serious injuries by 2040. Vision Zero is a critical component of the Mayor's and DTPW's goal to make Miami-Dade County streets safe for everyone – no matter where people live, no matter their income, or choice to walk, bike, drive or take public transportation.



SW 27 Avenue from Bayshore Drive to US1

VISION ZERO MILESTONES IN 2023

ROAD TO ZERO GRANT: DTPW received a grant of \$150,000 from the National Safety Council to develop a Vision Zero Dashboard and conduct a Local Community Liaison Pilot Project.

HIGHWAY SAFETY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (HSIP) GRANT: DTPW received an HSIP Federal grant to fund 3 Vision Zero Implementation Projects.

SAFE STREETS AND ROADS FOR ALL (SS4A) GRANT: DTPW received a Federal grant for \$16.2 Million to fund 24 Vision Zero safety projects and additional safety planning activities.

VISION ZERO OUTREACH: DTPW

conducted a total of 55 outreach events throughout the county to introduce the Vision Zero Program. Nearly three-quarters of these events were held in equity districts.

VISION ZERO ACTION PLAN UPDATE:

The Vision Zero Action Plan was updated to refine the Countywide High Injury Network (HIN) to prioritize Vision Zero funding to eliminate fatal and serious injury crashes while addressing equity in historically underserved communities

VISION ZERO OUTREACH

Between August 2022 and November 2023, DTPW's Vision Zero Team participated in 55 outreach events, including the solemn World Day of Remembrance to promote greater awareness of road safety. Officials also staffed the 2023 Miami Book Fair and other major gatherings. DTPW received a Road to Zero Grant to fund the development of a community liaison outreach pilot program, focused on providing education and assessing user behaviors/comfort level in priority neighborhoods where Vision Zero projects were recently installed.

SOUTH FLORIDA COMMUTER SERVICES

Established under Chapter 341, F.S., South Florida Commuter Services is FDOT's official Transportation Demand Management (TDM) program for District 4 and District 6. TDM is a set. of strategies designed to help reduce congestion through the promotion of travel choices to the public, thus reducing SOV trips.

Structure

Continuous daily operation (M-F) carrying out multimedia and grassroots marketing, customer support, and planning. The database of registered customers is over 50k and growing.
